TOBACCO TREATMENT: AN OVERVIEW OF CESSATION SERVICES FOR OLDER ADULTS AND INDIANA MEDICAID MEMBERS Wednesday, April 29 2020 @ 12:00 - 1:00pm EST

The impact of tobacco use in Indiana is staggering, costing the state 11,100 Hoosier lives each year. About one in five Hoosier adults (21.1%) were current smokers in 2018. In particular, smoking rates were HIGHEST among adults with lower education, lower income, uninsured, and those with poor mental health status.

Join us, as we'll hear from industry experts about the specific tobacco cessation services offered through the Medicare program and the Indiana Medicaid program, including frequently asked questions that often arise when trying to effectively connect patients to these services.
